Polite Reminder

We would like to remind parents and carers that **no child should be on the school premises before 8:30am** unless they are accompanied by a responsible adult or they are attending Breakfast Club. Breakfast Club starts at 7:30am at a cost of £2, and your child's place does not need to be booked in advance.

Holiday Requests

As directed by the school's Education Welfare Officer (EWO), we are unable to authorise any holidays in term time. We are aware that many holiday requests are made – **the school cannot authorise such requests.**

Please remember that, "In the case of an unauthorised absence the Education Welfare Services may be notified and a Penalty Notice may be issued. **Please note that a Penalty is issued to each parent for each child taken out of school. A Penalty Notice carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days, increasing to £120 if paid within 28 days. If the fine is not paid after 28 days, it may result in legal action being taken against you. Parents have a duty to ensure their child's regular attendance at school and failure to do so is an offence under Section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996.**"

As an example, a two parent family with two children would be fined £240 (if paid within 21 days) – Mother pays £60 x 2 children; Father pays £60 x 2 children = £240 **per week.**

Building Work

We are very lucky to have been awarded a grant from the Government to replace most of the school roof. The works will be starting on Friday 21st June when the scaffolding will be erected at the front and to the side (Key Stage 2) of the school. The contractors will have the parking bays next to our container for their equipment and 2 other bays.

An assembly for the children will take place on Monday 24th June to explain what is happening and how to stay safe. It is expected that the work will take 16 weeks, extending into the summer holidays when the roof on EYFS and Key Stage 1 will also be replaced. Please help us to keep all children off the scaffolding and take care when walking around the site.
