News from school...

We have also been going now since February without a break. Thank you and well done to the school-based staff for their hard work and energy. Parents, you equally deserve a mention and well done for coping with home learning, the good days and the challenging ones too!

The team communicating and working on learning from home have been real troopers keeping on top of the learning, checking the posts and keeping in touch. They have weekly zoom meetings to discuss learning and the curriculum for September. We can't wait to see you all again and be together as a team!

Polite reminder – it is a statutory requirement we hear from every child every 10 days. If we have not heard from you and cannot get hold of you, we will have to refer the matter to the Education Welfare Officer.

We are currently considering the guidance published yesterday by the government for all children to be back in school in September. The detail given to schools requires some changes to our normal operating procedures. Our main concern is for your safety and that of your child/ren when you come onto the premises and leave. We do know that social distancing will remain and classes will operate in bubbles of 30. Therefore, we will be required to operate a staggered start and collection time, maintain a way one system, leave at least a one metre gap between you and another adult and continue with our protective hygiene measures and restrictions to the main building. We apologise in advance for not being able to welcome you, the parents and carers into the building until further notice and we must insist on only one adult accompanying your child/ren.



From September, we are planning a 'Reconnect and Recovery Curriculum' that aims to support your child's return to school in a supportive and highly imaginative way. We recognise that for many children, coming back to school after a long absence will be daunting. We are putting together a series of resources focusing on helping to bring our school community back together again. We will use classroom assemblies to promote emotional well-being, resilience and recovery and participate in creative activities and pastoral themes for the first few weeks, adapting to the needs of the class and individuals as we go.

Free School Meals

Any child currently in receipt of benefits-related free school meals or who becomes eligible during the summer term is eligible for the Covid Summer Food Fund. 

Below are 10 coins arranged in three lines of four coins:




Your task is to re-arrange the same ten coins to make FIVE lines of four coins.
