Now that our results have been agreed and published by the Government, we are really happy to share our successes with you!

Progress across Key Stage 2 (By the End of Year 6) is Outstanding!

- Pupils at our school make 'well above average progress'.
- We are ranked 11th out of 268 primary schools in Cornwall for progress in **Reading**!
- We are ranked 13th for progress in **Writing**!
- We are ranked 16th for progress in **Mathematics**!

- At the end of Year 6, progress in **Writing** has been in the top 20% of all schools in England for the last 2 years for all pupils.
- Progress in **Reading** and **Writing** was significantly above average and in the highest 10% of all schools in England!

Attainment at Key Stage 2 (By the End of Year 6) is Outstanding!

- In 2018, 90% of Year 6 pupils achieved the standard for **Reading**
- 83% achieved the standard in **Writing**.
- 81% achieved the standard in **Mathematics**.
- Overall, 75% of pupils achieved the expected standard in **Reading**, **Writing** and **Mathematics** combined. This was well above the National Average (64%)!

Key Stage 1

- Our results in the Year 2 SATs have been getting better for the past three years!
- Our results in the Year 1 Phonics Check has been getting better for the past three years too!
