

Protocol for drop off and pick up including protective measures to minimise risk.

Arrival times

- Children of keyworkers can enter through the main entrance between 7:45 and 8:30
- From 4th June, vulnerable pupils and EYFS children must arrive between 8:45 and 9 and follow the directions to the main playground.
- From Monday 8th June, if capacity allows, Year 1 children should arrive between 8:30 and 8:45 and follow the directions to the main playground.
- The date for Year 6 has yet to be decided, but if this happens, they will arrive between 8:15 and 8:30

Protocol and safety measures

- If your child has any of the symptoms of the Coronavirus or a temperature above 37.8 degrees do not bring them in and phone and inform the school
- All children will need to come in clean clothes every day, we are not asking them to wear school uniform.
- On entering the school grounds ALL visitors must abide by the two meter social distance rules and must follow the markings.
- Children will arrive with **one adult** from their household. Siblings should not come with them unless there is absolutely no one to stay at home with them. If they have to come they must stay close to the adult at all times. Children will not be able to arrive or leave with a member of another household.
- Children must not leave the adult until they have walked them to the external door
- Parents will not be allowed to enter the building.
- If a child is distressed on leaving their parent, we ask that you keep moving and loop the building. If they are still not ready to enter the class as they pass the classroom, we will have to ask you to take them home.

Expectations for Behaviour and Diamond rules

Children in school will, as always, be expected to follow the diamond rules. We have added extra rules to minimise risk.

- Catch it, bin it, kill it
- Leave a good gap
- Wash our hands
- Follow the diamond rules

Due to the current situation, and to minimise risk, we have had to change the consequences to keep everyone safe.

- If a child is violent they will be asked to go home and will not be able to return until the guidelines change
- If a child refuses or breaks the rules, they will be given a Time Out in the bubble
- If this behaviour is persistent they may be asked to complete a task, in the bubble, such as writing out the rules, and they not participate in bubble activities and we may ask you to collect your child..
