### Threadworms

Just like head lice, the presence of threadworms in schools is becoming more widespread.

#### Symptoms

- Small white worms in poo
- Loss of appetite
- Disturbed sleep
- Itching and scratching bottom
- Bed wetting

#### Treatment

Treat them with Oxev which can be bought from Boots/Tesco for about £12.

Alternatively, seek advice from your doctor or health visitor.



### Preventing Threadworms

- wash hands and scrub under fingernails – particularly before eating, after using the toilet or changing nappies
- encourage children to wash hands regularly
- bathe or shower every morning
- rinse toothbrushes before using them
- keep fingernails short
- wash sleepwear, sheets, towels and soft toys (at normal temperature)
- disinfect kitchen and bathroom surfaces
- vacuum and dust with a damp cloth
- make sure children wear underwear at night – change it in the morning
